Stabilization Grant for Charitable Organizations and Licensed Providers (Round 2)	<p>Most eligible entities will receive \$12,000. Organizations in areas disproportionately impacted by COVID-19 will receive \$27,000. Disproportionately impacted areas are determined by DHHS through analysis of COVID-19 cases per capita, per zip code as of June 30, 2020. Grantees will be notified of their award amount at the time of award notification.</p> <p>Eligible Assisted Living Facilities and Long-Term Care Facilities, licensed by DHHS, will be awarded funds based on their licensed bed capacity. Award amounts will be announced at a later date.</p> <p>Organizations that received a Stabilization Grant in Round 1 (awarded in July 2020) are not eligible for Round 2 funding. The only exception to this rule is Assisted Living Facilities and Long-Term Care Facilities. Eligible expenses include, but are not limited to, those incurred since March 13, 2020, for normal business operations, such as rent, utilities, and payroll. Stabilization Round 2 funds also may be used for Covid-19-related expenses, such as PPE and cleaning supplies. All Stabilization Round 2 funds must be expended by December 30, 2020 and may not be used for expenses after that date.</p>
Healthy Places Grant for Centers of Worship (Round 2)	<p>Approved applicants will receive \$1,500 for this purpose.</p> <p>Centers of worship that received a Healthy Places Grant in Round 1 (awarded in July 2020) are not eligible for Round 2 funding.</p>	<p>To be eligible to apply for Healthy Places Round 2 funding, your organization must be a center of worship in Nebraska and tax-exempt under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.</p>	<p>Funds can be used for the purchase of personal protective equipment (PPE) such as masks and gloves, and cleaning supplies recommended for mitigating the spread of COVID-19. Funds will be distributed as one-time payments.</p>
Small Business Stabilization Program (Round 2)	<p>Businesses and livestock producers who previously received awards under Round 1 of this program and are not considered a Restaurant, Bar, Hotel, Convention Center, Body Art, Salon, Nail Technology Salon, Cosmetology & Esthetic Salon, Massage Therapist, or Barber are NOT eligible for a second grant.</p> <p>Each approved applicant will receive funding of equal amounts. Awards will not exceed \$12,000 and will be awarded on a first-come, first-served basis.</p> <p>First-come, first-served will be determined based on the latest date of submission of a complete and final submission. For example, if an applicant submits an application and later makes modifications or provides updated or missing information, the re-submission date will be considered as the official submission date of the application.</p> <p>Further, applicants can only receive one grant per Nebraska withholding ID.</p>	<p>Nebraska-owned for-profit businesses who are licensed as of October 1, 2020 are eligible to apply.</p> <p>Program Ineligible Businesses and Industries Businesses in the following industries are NOT eligible:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Mining (NAICS 21) Utilities (NAICS 22) Finance and Insurance (NAICS 52) Management of Companies & Enterprises (NAICS 55) Educational Services (NAICS 61) Public Administration (NAICS 92) Lobbyist and Political Organizations <p>Further, businesses and livestock producers who previously received awards under Round 1 of this program and are not considered a Restaurant, Bar, Hotel, Convention Center, Body Art Salon, Nail Technology Salon, Cosmetology & Esthetic Salon, Massage Therapist, or Barber are NOT eligible for a second grant.</p> <p>Dedicated programs have been established specifically for Restaurants, Bars, Hotels, Convention Centers, Livestock producers, and licensed personal care organizations (i.e., Body Art, Nail Technology Salons, Cosmetology & Esthetic Salons, Massage Therapists, and Barbers licensed with the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services</p> <p>Note: Livestock Producers that received funding under Round 1 of the Small Business Livestock Producers Stabilization program are NOT eligible for funding under Round 2.</p>	<p>Businesses can use the Small Business Stabilization grant as working capital to pay for operational expenses, with the purpose of helping sustain the business during the economic downturn or preparing it to bounce back.</p>
Livestock Producer Stabilization Program (Round 2)	<p>Each approved applicant will receive funding of equal amounts Awards will not exceed \$12,000 and will be awarded on a first-come, first-served basis.</p> <p>First-come, first-served will be determined based on the latest date of submission of a complete and final submission. For example, if an applicant submits an application and later makes modifications or provides updated or missing information, the re-submission date will be considered as the official submission date of the application.</p> <p>Only one application and funding award allowed for each livestock producer operation (i.e., although a ranch or farm is jointly owned by one or more individuals, the ranch or farm will only be eligible to submit one application for consideration).</p> <p>Further, producers who previously received awards under Round 1 of this program or the Small Business program are NOT eligible for a second grant.</p>	<p>Nebraska livestock producers with 1 to 10 employees* are eligible to apply. Hotels Convention Centers Stabilization Program	<p>Each eligible applicant will receive funding. Funding will be based on the total number of eligible applicants and awarded on a tiered basis according to the total square feet of meeting space as reported to STR, where applicable.</p>	<p>Nebraska Hotels and Convention Centers that previously received a grant under the Small Business Stabilization program are still eligible for this program.</p> <p>Applicants can only receive one grant per Nebraska withholding ID.</p>	<p>Hotels and Convention Centers can use the grant as working capital to pay for operating expenses, with the purpose of helping them bounce back during this period of economic downturn.</p>
Event Centers and Sports Arenas Stabilization Program	<p>All eligible applicants will receive funding. Funding will be tiered based on the total square feet of indoor meeting space or fixed seating and the number of contracted events.</p> <p>Applicants can only receive one grant per FEIN.</p>	<p>Free-standing event centers (space is not located inside a hotel) and sports arenas with at least 25,000 square foot of indoor meeting/convention space or a minimum of 4,000 fixed seats (seating can be indoor or outdoor).</p> <p>Facilities jointly owned/operated by universities, colleges, community colleges, public and private schools are ineligible.</p> <p>Golf courses and rodeo grounds are ineligible.</p>	<p>Events Centers and Sports Arenas can use the grant as working capital to pay for operating expenses, with the purpose of helping them bounce back during this period of economic downturn.</p>
Restaurants and Bars Stabilization Program	<p>Eligible applicants who previously participated in Round 1 will receive \$12,000 on a first-come, first-served basis.</p> <p>Eligible applicants who did NOT participate in Round 1 will receive \$24,000 on a first-come, first-served basis.</p> <p>First-come, first-served will be determined based on the latest date of submission of a complete and final submission. For example, if an applicant submits an application and later makes modifications or provides updated or missing information, the re-submission date will be considered as the official submission date of the application.</p> <p>Applicants can only receive one grant per Nebraska withholding ID.</p>	<p>Restaurants and Bars that are licensed for withholding on or before October 1, 2020.</p>	<p>Restaurants and bars can use the grant as working capital to pay for operating expenses, with the purpose of helping them bounce back during this period of economic downturn.</p>

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<p>Licensed Personal Service Business Stabilization Program</p>	<p>The Directed Health Measures resulted in the closure of several industries during the initial outbreak of COVID-19. Many of the businesses in these industries were deemed not eligible for our initial Small Business Stabilization Grants because they are not licensed for withholding. The Licensed Personal Services Stabilization Program provides stimulus up to \$12,000 to Body Art, Nail Technology Salons, Cosmetology & Esthetic Salons, Massage Therapists, and Barbers who are licensed with the Nebraska Dept. of Health and Human Services (DHHS) as of October 1, 2020.</p> <p>All eligible applicants will receive \$12,000 on a first-come, first-served basis.</p> <p>Further, businesses who previously received awards under Round 1 of the Small Business Stabilization program are NOT eligible for a second grant.</p> <p>First-come, first-served will be determined based on the latest date of submission of a complete and final submission. For example, if an applicant submits an application and later makes modifications or provides updated or missing information, the re-submission date will be considered as the official submission date of the application.</p> <p>Applicants can only receive one grant per DHHS license number. Barbers can only receive one grant per Board of Barber Examiners license number.</p>	<p>Body Art Salons, Nail Technology Salons, Cosmetology & Esthetic Salons, Massage Therapists, and Barbers licensed with the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services as of October 1, 2020.</p>	<p>Body Art Salons, Nail Technology Salons, Cosmetology & Esthetic Salons, Massage Therapists, and Barbers can use the grant as working capital to pay for operating expenses, with the purpose of helping them bounce back during this period of economic downturn.</p>
<p>Movie Theatre Stabilization Program</p>	<p>Eligible applicants will receive \$10,000 per screen on a first-come, first-served basis.</p> <p>First-come, first-served will be determined based on the latest date of submission of a complete and final submission. For example, if an applicant submits an application and later makes modifications or provides updated or missing information, the re-submission date will be considered as the official submission date of the application.</p> <p>Applicants can only receive one grant per Nebraska withholding ID.</p>	<p>Currently re-opened (or soon-to-reopen) and actively operating Nebraska-based theatres with a minimum of one (1) operating screen are eligible for this program.</p> <p>Permanently closed theatres are not eligible for this program.</p> <p>Non-profit Movie Theatres are eligible for this program.</p>	<p>Movie Theatres can use funds as working capital to pay for operating expenses, with the purpose of helping them bounce back during this period of economic downturn.</p>
